KTEH LAUNCHES *DOCTOR WHO* BLOG AND ONLINE VIDEO CHALLENGE

Winner of the “How *Who* Are You?” video challenge will host
a *Doctor Who* marathon on KTEH 54

SAN JOSE, December 23, 2008 – Fans of *Doctor Who* now have a new online community site dedicated to their favorite science fiction program. KTEH Public Television (www.kteh.org) announces the launch of the “Time Space Visualiser” (www.kteh.org/doctorwho), a blog devoted to all things *Doctor Who*. Fans can share their enthusiasm, knowledge, and insights about the popular show at the same place where KTEH posts series information, details about local upcoming events, guest essays, trivia, and more. *Doctor Who* airs on KTEH Fridays at 11pm as part of the Brilliantly British television lineup.
