EXPLORE THE BOLINAS LAGOON WITH *CALL IT HOME* ON KQED'S *TRULY CA*

SAN FRANCISCO, September 12, 2008 – Experience the majestic beauty of the Bolinas Lagoon with *Call it Home*, airing as part of KQED's documentary film series *Truly CA* Sunday, October 12 at 6pm on KQED 9. One of the few relatively untouched coastal wetlands left on the West Coast, this ecological wonder has begun to silt up in recent years and has become noticeably shallower. These changes have led to a decades-long community debate among local environmentalists, homeowners, and fisherman to understand the forces affecting its future. Opinions on what to do about it range from large scale dredging to no action at all. Narrated by Robin Wright Penn, *Call it Home* captures the democratic but volatile debate among locals in a small Northern California seaside community that helped to birth the environmental movement.
